National Organ and Tissue Donation Awareness Week - April 21-27, 2019



National Organ and Tissue Donation Awareness Week (NOTDAW) is an opportunity to honour organ and tissue donors, and their families, who have so graciously given the gift of life, and who have helped improve the health of many individuals who needed a transplant.

It's also a week to enhance awareness around the demand for organ and tissue donation and the benefits of transplantation.

2018 Alberta Organ and Tissue Donation Activity

One organ donor can often donate multiple organs suitable for transplant.

Organs donated in Alberta in 2018:

Hearts	18
Lungs	64
Livers	45
Pancreas	15
Kidneys	112
Kidneys – Living Donors	61
Livers – Living Donors	12

One tissue donor can often improve the quality of life of up to 75 individual recipients.

Number of Albertans who chose to be tissue donors in 2018, or their families who made the decision on their behalf:

Patient and Family Centred Care


AHS policy and provincial legislation requires staff ensure all families are made aware of potential opportunities to donate.

At end-of-life, contact the Southern Alberta Organ & Tissue Donation Program (SAOTDP), the Human Organ Procurement & Exchange (HOPE) Program, or the Comprehensive Tissue Centre (CTC) for all patients less than 81 years to discuss donation opportunities.

Donation Intentions

Albertans are encouraged to discuss their wishes with their families. They may also register their intent to donate organs and tissues through myhealth.alberta.ca.

Donor Coordinators have access to the Alberta Organ and Tissue Donation Registry for potential donors who have expressed their donation intents.





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Post Donation Support

Grief support is offered to families for the first year post-transplant and then as requested.

Donor families are invited to the Annual Donor Recognition Service in which each family is presented with a commemorative medal to honour their loved ones for their gifts of life.

Donor families and recipients are encouraged to have healthy and positive anonymous correspondence. There may be opportunities to meet in the future if eligibility requirements are met.

Alberta Programs

Two organ procurement organizations within Alberta collaborate to care for organ and tissue donors and their families. Donor Coordinators are available 24/7 to support the organ and tissue donation process.
